FIRST READING Ephesians 1.3-14

³ Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, ⁴ just as he chose us in Christ^[a] before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. ⁵ He destined us for adoption as his children

through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, ⁶ to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. ⁷ In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace ⁸ that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight ⁹ he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, ¹⁰ as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. ¹¹ In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, ¹⁰ having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, ¹² so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. ¹³ In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; ¹⁴ this^[c] is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

SECOND READING 2 Samuel 6.1-5, 12b-19

David again gathered all the chosen men of Israel, thirty thousand. ² David and all the people with him set out and went from Baale-judah, to bring up from there the ark of God, which is called by the name of the LORD of hosts who is enthroned on the cherubim. ³ They carried the ark of God on a new cart, and brought it out of the house of Abinadab, which was on the hill. Uzzah and Ahio, ^a the sons of Abinadab, were driving the new cart ⁴ with the ark of God; ^b and Ahio ^c went in front of the ark. ⁵ David and all the house of Israel were dancing before the LORD with all their might, with songs ^d and lyres and harps and tambourines and castanets and cymbals.

¹² It was told King David, "The LORD has blessed the household of Obededom and all that belongs to him, because of the ark of God." So David went and brought up the ark of God from the house of Obed-edom to the city of David with rejoicing; ¹³ and when those who bore the ark of the LORD had gone six paces, he sacrificed an ox and a fatling. ¹⁴ David

danced before the LORD with all his might; David was girded with a linen ephod. ¹⁵ So David and all the house of Israel brought up the ark of the LORD with shouting, and with the sound of the trumpet.

¹⁶ As the ark of the LORD came into the city of David, Michal, daughter of Saul looked out of the window, and saw King David leaping and dancing before the LORD; and she despised him in her heart.

¹⁷ They brought in the ark of the LORD, and set it in its place, inside the tent that David had pitched for it; and David offered burnt offerings and offerings of well-being before the LORD. ¹⁸ When David had finished offering the burnt offerings and the offerings of well-being, he blessed the people in the name of the LORD of hosts, ¹⁹ and distributed food among all the people, the whole multitude of Israel, both men and women, to each a cake of bread, a portion of meat, ^[a] and a cake of raisins. Then all the people went back to their homes.

UPCOMING EVENTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Changes in COVID-19 Protocols

The Session met on Wednesday, June 23 for our monthly stated meeting, and given the latest guidance from the CDC, has decided to further relax some of our protocols surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic. The changes are listed below. As always, the Session encourages everyone to engage in the practices that are best for you and your family. We will continue to offer worship online as well as in person, and we hope that you will take advantage of the online option when you are not able or comfortable attending worship inperson. All of the changes in protocols went into effect on Sunday, July 4.

In Worship

- Masks will no longer be required during worship. The Session does encourage unvaccinated individuals to follow CDC guidelines and to wear masks as you feel comfortable, but they will not be required.
- There will no longer be a pandemic imposed limitation on the number of individuals able to worship in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings. So please – bring your friends and let's fill the sanctuary with God's family!
- The ushers will no longer seat people every other pew, but we do encourage people that, when possible, they seat themselves at the distance they feel comfortable from other worshipers.
 - For attendance, we will return to passing the pew pads for all
 worshipers to sign in and register their attendance. The Worship and
 Music Team will be investigating ways of making sure that requests
 for a call or appropriate attendance records will be taken care of.
 They will report back on this at our August Session meeting. The

Mission and Outreach Team will be working on ways of making sure that we connect with visitors or individuals that we have not seen for a while to provide a welcoming atmosphere. They also will report back on this at our August Session meeting.

- For offering, we will keep the offering plates in the Narthex through the month of September. An usher or greeter will be invited to bring the offering forward at the time of the offering, and the doxology will be sung in worship following the Prayer of Dedication. Worshipers are invited to place their offering in the plate before or after worship. This decision was made not because of COVID-19 concerns; rather due to concerns about staffing volunteers during the summer months. The Worship and Music Team will be considering offering collection options and will report back on this at our August Session meeting.
- For communion, we will continue to use the prepackaged communion sets through the month of September. Again, this decision was made not because of COVID-19 concerns, but in order to keep consistency for ushers and preparers and allow time to find volunteers needed for our former ways. The Worship and Music Team will discuss communion and report back to Session in August or September. Additionally, Pastor Lindsay will give more clear instruction on when to take communion in the liturgy the next time we take it (on July 4).

• In Other Programs:

All programs outside of worship are welcome to return to pre-COVID standards and regulations. They may meet without masks and social distancing, and may begin their work. This includes all choirs, outside groups, meetings, and Christian Education programming over the summer as well as the programs which resume in the fall. Groups or individuals are welcome to decide to continue meeting via Zoom or wearing masks if that is what is comfortable and safe for them. At Vacation Bible School, masks will be optional for both children and adult volunteers. Again, the Session emphasizes that families and individuals should do what is most comfortable and safe for themselves.

As always, the Session will be reporting this information in worship, and we do invite any questions or concerns to be sent to members of Session for consideration and discussion. We thank everyone for working together to see us safely through the pandemic.
