Dear Family of God at Cross Roads,

It is with great excitement that Alex and I announce to all of you (if you haven't already heard) that we are expecting a baby girl, due August 24, 2024. We are thrilled for Maeve to be a big sister (she is too...she announced it to the preschool several weeks ago), and we are excited to have another child of ours be welcomed and grow in this wonderful congregation at Cross Roads.

You may be wondering how this will work out when I will be away again. Don't panic. As usual, your pastor has a detailed plan for who will cover what things and how things will go while I'm away on maternity leave. It's my intention to begin my maternity leave on Monday, August 12 and return from leave on Sunday, November 3 (All Saints Day). I'm hoping to begin before my due date for 3 important reasons: 1. To allow some time with Maeve before she becomes a big sister; 2. Because August is hot, and I will undoubtedly be uncomfortable; and 3. Because I'm eager to return to the pulpit in November so that I can be fully prepared for the Advent season. As you know, babies rarely do things on our timeline, so of course, these dates are subject to change.

While I'm away, there are a few Sundays when we will have special events, like Youth Sunday and the Family Fall Festival where preaching will not occur. There are also a few Sundays where Ben will preach, and one Sunday when Rev. Brian Wallace, Associate Minister of Pittsburgh Presbytery, will be preaching as well. Other Sundays will be filled in by a pastor in Pittsburgh Presbyter; I'm still working on identifying that person (I have several options), but it will hopefully be the same pastor on all the other weeks. The Session will be moderated by Rev. Phil Beck, Pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Tarentum. Pastoral Care concerns will be handled by a small group of Deacons and Elders and referred to local clergy (including my Christian colleagues at the Monroeville Interfaith Ministerium) for things like funerals. This detailed plan was presented to Session as a first draft on February 28 and will be approved in detail at a future Session meeting.

In 2023, Pittsburgh Presbytery voted to start a grant fund for pastors who go on parental leave. The Session will be applying for that grant money to cover the cost of substitute preachers and moderators while I am away. This means that my time away will cost virtually nothing, which is always good news!

Alex, Maeve, and I would like to thank you for your support and invite you into prayer for us in this time of expectant waiting. New life is a gift from God; family is a gift from God. Sharing this joyful news from our family to our extended Cross Roads family is indeed a gift from God, and we are incredibly grateful for these gifts. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask. In the meantime, I'm ready to do ministry together!

## Session Updates February 2024

The Session had two called meetings since our last stated meeting.

**January 31:** On January 31, the Session met for a called meeting. The purpose of this meeting was to approve the plan moving forward after Chrissy Newmyer's departure. On recommendation from the Personnel Committee, the Session voted to...

- Move forward with a plan to hire a part time Administrative Assistant (20 hours per week) who would focus on bulletin, E-pistle, Connections, maintaining the calendar, and other office assistant tasks. We will also hire a part-time Financial Assistant (5 hours per week) who will input deposits, print financial reports, and write checks on a weekly basis.
- Approve the job descriptions for these two positions and the task forces who are seeking to hire for these positions.

**February 11:** On February 11, the Session met for a called meeting. The purpose of this meeting was to receive a report from the Treasurer and the Finance Committee regarding the Budget for 2024.

The Session...

- Approved the 2024 Budget (which was presented to the congregation on February 25)
- Noted with joy the increase in pledges received for 2024 and the continual increased giving we are observing in our church.
- Discussed the Finance Committee's plan to continue to fund ministries that haven't yet been funded.

The Session also had a stated meeting on Wednesday, February 28. Because of publication deadlines for Connections, we don't have everything that was voted on at that meeting, but the following items were set for action.

- Deb Robinson requested a transfer of her membership, which the Session will vote to grant.
- A draft of Pastor Lindsay's maternity leave proposal was received.

## **Personnel Update**

Following Chrissy's departure in early February, the Personnel Committee and the Session decided to split Chrissy's job into two smaller part-time positions:

Administrative Assistant (20 hours per week): The Administrative Assistant will take on Chrissy's responsibilities of creating the bulletin, E-Pistle, Connections, and other publications in our church. They will also be responsible for managing the church calendar, office supplies, and other typical administrative functions. This person will work during the day, likely 4 hours per day, Monday through Friday, and will be present in the front church office during their work hours.

**Financial Assistant** (5 hours per week): The Financial Assistant will take on Chrissy's responsibilities of entering deposits, generating financial reports, and issuing checks. They will work in the finance office, but the hours may be flexible depending on the schedule.

Two task forces have been elected by Personnel and Session to begin the search for these employees.

Administrative Assistant Task Force: Lucille Jenkins (chair), Kelley Rupchak, Dick Haessler, Sue Lomeo, and Rennie Rhodes. The team is currently receiving applications for consideration for the position.

**Financial Assistant Task Force:** Bob Kendig (chair), Beverly Reinhardt, Ilona Beatty, and Jon Junker. The team is currently receiving applications for consideration for the position.

Both positions have been posted on local media and on our website. Please encourage interested parties to inquire.

## Youth Group

My father and I had a harrowing experience this past week and I think it helps to explain the necessity of helping young people to develop a strong foundation in Christ as early as possible. My brother had surgery this past week. He is well and recovering nicely. But he lives in the state of Indiana and so I went out last week to help him get to and from the surgery as well as making him meals and other important recovery processes.

My dad and I were supposed to trade places on Friday. When the time came to hit the road, Indiana was being slammed by a snowstorm that made the roads a dangerous mess. Unfortunately, my dad was already only an hour away from my brother's apartment, and he lost control of his car and slid into a small ravine on the side of the road. Thankfully, he did not sustain any injuries and the car was almost entirely spared of damage. I made it to him safely (barely) and waited for AAA to come and drag the car free.

There are more details to this story that made it more complicated and concerning, especially not being certain it was safe to leave my brother alone for those hours while I was helping with my dad. When we finally went our separate ways, the roads were much clearer, and the snow had stopped. In total, what was supposed to be a 5 hour drive home became a 12 HOUR DRIVE HOME!

As I ultimately made my way home, I had time to reflect on the experience as a whole, and I saw God's hands at work in the entire experience. My dad had slid across an intersection and no cars were coming in either direction. He missed any and all trees in the ravine he slid into and instead landed in a "web of branches" that cradled the car to a stop. He was far enough off the road to avoid being a danger to any and all drivers out that night. And I had just happened to be 3 minutes down the road from him when he crashed.

Was this an ideal evening? Of course not. But as I drove and I reflected, I was comforted by the knowledge that God had protected us, even in the midst of the storm.

This is the message we try to impart on our young people in all of our youth programs. We want them to understand that life is not always going to be easy. Often times it is going to be downright painful. But if we put our faith in God, and if we allow the God that loves us beyond all reason or understanding to be a part of our lives, we will see where God is guiding us, where God is protecting us, and where God is holding us and it allows us to see that we are never alone. We all need to be reminded of that sometimes.
